Year 1 have had a brilliant time learning all about the features of countries in their Geography unit. Pupils are able to identify what makes a country and explored countries across Africa. Using their enquiry skills, pupils learnt about Kenya and the surrounding countries.

In 1B, pupils started learning about where our school, Belleville Wix Academy is. Pupils were in awe of the aerial view of the world. They can confidently name the country, city and town they live in. They even located BWA using google Earth. Fantastic leaning.

Pupils in Year 2 had fun this week when they completed their traditional tales unit in English. Taking it in turns to play the part of the big bad wolf and the police officer, pupils enjoyed bringing an alternative version of a story to life with some classroom drama. They were very creative and entertained their peers with their alternative versions.





Year 3 have had a brilliant start to the half-term, launching their new Science topic exploring Food and the sense of taste. They particularly enjoyed trying different types of food and drink to discover how taste is affected by smell, texture, colour, appearance and temperature. They were very surprised to discover that the red lemonade was not in fact strawberry flavour!

A highlight for Year 4 this week has been taking part in their new 'Performance Poetry' unit in English. Pupils have loved investigating the work of Joseph Coelho and creating their own comical poems based on his original poem, 'A Little bit of Food'. The class came up with some creative and entertaining verses. Pupils really enjoyed performing them for their peers.



This week Year 5 started their new history topic - 'Who gets remembered and why?' Pupils enjoyed discussing a range of recent and past history makers as well as debating whether these people should be remembered. It was excellent to listen to the pupils explain and evidence their points of view.



This week, 5B have been exploring the Lady of Shalot, by Lord Alfred Tennyson. Using their reading skills to find evidence to inform inference, pupils generated some mature and insightful opinions about this poem which, at times, can be quite challenging to comprehend. We have been particularly impressed with the levels of empathy the pupils have expressed for the Lady of Shalott locked away in her castle, unable to engage with the world outside.

NATURAL HISTORY MUSEUM Year 6 went on a fabulous educational visit to the National History Museum this week to consolidate their learning about Earthquakes and Volcanoes. They had a self-guided tour around the museum before taking part in an Earthquakes and Volcanoes show. The pupils were wonderful and everyone came away having learnt something new.
