
and despite the rain were able to listen and learn from a professional. What a session to remember.



<u>Learning with our resident artists - Year 1</u>

Year 1 have been learning with our resident artists to create a piece of art showing how our world changes throughout the seasons. The pupils developed lots of different skills such as painting using sponges, leaf rubbing and collage. Their final art work is fantastic.

We were super impressed with our nursery pupils who remained quiet for two minutes at 11am today. Pupils have made variety of poppies this week. They painted some poppies and made some out of collage.








Our pupils in 1B have been learning about Christianity in RE. Pupils learned about a baptism and to show their understanding they had an opportunity to re-enact one.

This week, pupils in our 2B class started exploring the 5's times table. They made fantastic links between skip counting in 5's and the times tables. One pattern they noticed was that when an odd number was multiplied by 5, the product (answer) will end in a 5 and when an even number was multiplied by 5, the product will end in a 0.

During their science lessons this week, pupils in Year 2 tested the suitability of different materials, to answer the Key Question: 'What material is most suitable for a new gym kit?' Using a meter ruler, a weight and different materials, they carried out a hands-on investigation and recorded their results. They concluded that lycra would be the best choice as it was the most stretchy, as well as being absorbent and durable.



Pupils in 3M stepped into the shoes of Dick King Smith this week and had a go at writing a new scene for their English text, 'George Speaks'. Pupils included dialogue in their narratives and although it can be tricky remembering where to put inverted commas, they used the special song we have been practising in lessons to help them remember and did an excellent job.

3S continued their scientific experiments this week by carrying out a comparative test to discover which material would be most suitable surface for a toy car to move on. They tested out different materials such as, felt, cotton and wood. Pupils learned that in order for the toy car to move best, the material must have the following properties: smooth, flat and strong.






Science was also a highlight for pupils in 4A. they have conducted a number of science experiments into gas this week - using balloons to investigate questions such as does gas weigh anything, what happens if we heat a gas and can we make a gas from a solid and a liquid? Pupils loved these sessions.

Pupils in 4W have really enjoyed exploring the text, 'The Lost Thing' in greater detail. They watched the animated film version to help them develop vivid character and setting descriptions using expanded noun phrases and prepositional phrases and wrote their own narratives about the adventures of the main character, Shaun.

This week in history, Year 5 explored the Olympics, both ancient and modern, in their new Ancient Greek unit. Pupils researched the differences and similarities between the Olympia tradition and what we see today. Using their enquiry skills, pupils assessed a variety of historical sources to collate detailed research. Pupils were so inspired by what they found,





Working with our resident artists, 5B produced incredible pieces based on the surrealist artist, Salvador Dali. They practiced their observational drawing skills as well as different ways of mark making with a variety of sketching pencils.

Today our year 6 pupils attended a talk to learn about how the local area was affected by the bombing in WW2. They spoke at length about Battersea, looked at a local map to identify areas we recognised and then establish if it had been hit during the war. On their walk back to school they looked at the differences in building styles of the houses to infer whether they had been damaged during the air raids or just rebuilt.
