It seems like a very long time since the Art Exhibition last week. Perhaps because it has been another extremely busy but exciting week of learning together. Pupils in Year 6 have sat their KS2 SATs throughout the week and we are all very proud of them. We were fortunate to have three governors join us on different days to see the tests being administered. Last Friday we also had an unannounced moderation visit to check the test papers were stored away securely.

This week pupils in Nursery have been practising linking numerals and amounts, by placing the matching number of aliens with each numbered rocket.





This week pupils in RB have been learning about life in the past by finding out about pirates. They had an amazing visit the Golden Hinde, a replica sailing ship owned by Francis Drake. They had a tour of the ship and impressed the hosts with their excellent questions and listening skills. Pupils loved finding out what pirates wore and they even got to take turns to load and fire a cannon! In class they have made maps and written descriptions of pirates. I think they are ready for quiet weekend.

To enrich their 'Sea 'Adventures' topic, pupils in RW went to The Golden Hinde a dry-docked ship. They walked down to the different levels in the ship and had a workshop with a real pirate. We were allowed to have lunch on the ship before designing their own treasure map. It was a great trip.

Year 1 loved working with our resident artist last Friday to create their own sunflowers with a variety of different art techniques including shading and stamping. You can see how they used tissue paper to make a collage background as well. Really excellent outcomes Year 1!



This week pupils in Year 2 used their persuasive language to write fantastic adverts for their chocolate inventions. Their outcomes were very successful and even had Miss Gordon and Miss Mieville wishing they could purchase the delicious treats they had invented.



Pupils in 2B have been working extremely hard in school this week. They are enjoying their English text, Charlie and the Chocolate Factory and studied 'The Chocolate Room' closely, listening to the wonderful words of Roald Dahl as well as watching parts of the original Charlie and the Chocolate Factory film. This helped pupils produce wonderful pieces of writing, using exciting vocabulary to describe what they saw in the chocolate room.




Last Friday, as part of their Science topic based on plants, Year 3 visited Kew Gardens. Pupils took part in an immersive experience, exploring the sights and smells of rainforest plants based in one of the magnificent glasshouses. They observed and investigated rainforest products and discussed the importance of the rainforest in our everyday lives.

To top it off, the sun was shining and pupils were able to have a picnic in beautiful surroundings during lunchtime - alongside a couple of hungry geese. Sincere thanks to the parents who volunteered to keep the pupils

safe on the trip and to our wonderful staff who organised this inspiring trip.

Pupils in 3B have been exploring reflective materials. Used torches they shone a light onto a variety of materials to determine if the light would be reflected or absorbed. They determined that mirrors, and most things made of plastic, are reflective and paper, wood and cloth do not reflect the light.



This week, pupils in Year 4 have really enjoyed continuing reading 'El Deafo.' They spent an English lesson researching how classrooms could be made 'deaf-friendly' to gather information for writing their own explanation texts. Pupils have shown great enthusiasm and interest in the story and can't wait to hear how it ends.



This week, our Year 5 class have been exploring how to convert units of length in maths. This is always a tricky concept to start with but they have worked hard to remember the key conversion facts. Pupils also know the importance of accurate measurement and conversion in many areas of life.

To celebrate the hard work of our pupils in Year 6 and 6B in the KS2 SATS this week, both classes enjoyed a well-earned break on Friday morning on Clapham Common. The pupils enjoyed sports and games before returning to school to watch the movie 'Holes' which they have been studying as an English text.

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


Donated Books
