During this period of national mourning we set up two focal points with pictures of our Queen, lit candles and flowers, very generously donated by Rob and Seb Van Helden. Sincere thanks for your support during our period of reflection.

Following the death of Her Majesty the Queen, it is His Majesty the King's wish that a period of Royal Mourning be observed and that Monday 19th September be a Bank Holiday. We wrote to you at the beginning of the week to inform you that BWA will be closed on this day. School will reopen on Tuesday 20th September.

Throughout this week I have seen excellent learning in every class. Here are some of the highlights of our week together.

On Thursday morning our Nursery class had their first dance lesson. I was in awe of how settled every pupil was and how well they listened to the teacher. It was a very special moment.

In Nursery, our pupils have enjoyed getting to know their new friends. They have explored a variety of different activities and have been particularly busy creating their own bear collages.



Our Reception pupils have settled in brilliantly. They have decided on their own set of class rules and created very realistic self-portraits using paint, wool and pens. Well done RW for such a fantastic start.

Pupils in RB have finished their very first English focus week. It has been wonderful to see them grow in confidence and make new friends. We have been very impressed with how had the confident they have been when sharing their learning. They have learnt some new phonics sounds and started making self-portraits. They are looking forward to their trip on Friday and we are very proud of how well they have settled – well done RB.

Pupils in our Year 1 class have been learning all about Tom's adventure in London. They have been writing some fantastic sentences describing his day out. During science they showed Miss To what super scientists they are when deciding how to describe the smell of chocolate, perfume,



coffee, vinegar and even rotten apples. I agree with Miss To when she says it has been a fantastic start to Year 1.

Pupils in Year 2 got off to a fantastic start with their learning in Science with a walk to Clapham Common as part of their topic, 'Who would choose a home like this?' They identified habitats and micro-habitats on their walk and discussed which animals, plants or

insects might live there and why.

This week, Year 3 had a guest speaker to launch their RE topic on Christianity. Mr Gately led a discussion about what the Bible teaches Christians and how it influences their lives. Pupils enjoyed sharing their knowledge of Bible stories, such as Noah's Ark. They also had the chance to see some very old editions of the Bible - one dating back to the 1600s!

This week pupils in 4B have enjoyed developing their map reading skills during their Geography lesson. They are able to identify the equator, lines of latitude, lines of longitude and can use this knowledge to locate places on a map.





Pupils in 4A have had a fantastic start with Mr Abraham. He has been very impressed with their incredible attitude to learning. Pupils thoroughly enjoyed their first swimming lesson of the year, following the adults instructions at all times when in the pool. They showed how responsible they are when travelling to and from the pool. 4W have had another great week of learning. A definite highlight was investigating their own teeth in Science - pupils used mirrors to identify which teeth they have in their mouths and learnt about the functions of the different types of teeth.

For our Year 5 pupils, the highlight of their week was planning and then carrying out an experiment to explore water resistance and buoyancy. By manipulating plasticine into various shapes and sizes, pupils were able to discover how the surface area of a shape affects buoyancy. They showed fantastic teamwork and enquiry skills throughout and even managed to keep the classroom dry.



Last week 5B made a great start to the year week. They loved starting their new topic in History about the Early Islamic Civilisation and tested out the suitability of different materials for setting world speed records in Science, as part of their Forces topic.

Year 6 pupils have had an incredible start to the year. As well as starting to appreciate the impact of World War II on Germany and Britain in History and delving into the science of inheritance, they have also shared many wonderful moments together as a class. Discussing our royal family and Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II has been very eye-opening. Pupils have approached these discussions with maturity and compassion. This has been a recurring theme for Year 6 – they are very eager to learn new things and show an appreciation of the world around them.

Pupils in 6B have shown great enthusiasm for their learning this week. They dissected a lamb heart in Science which has helped them understand how the circulatory system works.

This week our pupils in Early Years and KS1 have been focusing on how to move safely around a space to ensure they keep themselves safe during their PE lessons. Pupils in KS2 have been reflecting on how they show good sportsmanship and how to work effectively as a team.
