Please may I ask you to be cautious of the number of social interactions outside of school so that within our school community we are doing all we can to minimise the risk of any one of us contracting the virus. We have pupils and staff who live within vulnerable households who want to come to school however as the risk increases they are feeling very fearful of this. In the last 5 days we have closed 60% of our year 1 hubs — not virus related but still a significant % that will inevitably increase as we all return to school in September.
