Please note


- Some traffic is permitted on the road during the set hours so do take care when walking on the road at the beginning and end of day.

As you all know we were informed of our first positive case of COVID 19 this week. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation on Tuesday and Wednesday. It is much appreciated.

At the beginning of term I shared some research that is being carried out investigating whether children display different symptoms to adults. I do acknowledge that the government advice has not changed. I am aware of some GP's also quoting this research. A very young relative of mine tested positive this week with the symptoms referred to in the research but none of the main symptoms. The child who tested

positive this week was asymptomatic and would not have known they had the virus had they not taken part in a random trial. In light of this, I urge you to socially distance and encourage your children to do the same. We want our pupils to be in school and we can work together to keep our school community as safe as we can by following the government advice.
