

Assessment week

This week pupils in year 1 - 6 have been sitting their end of term assessments. We are very proud of their attitudes to their learning, everyone tried their very best. The results will help us identify gaps in learning so we can address these before the end of term and amend our spring term curriculum as necessary.



Birthday Celebrations in Nursery

Tom's 4th birthday was this week! Nursery have been looking at different ways people celebrate a birthday. They made balloon art pictures, wrapped birthday presents and talked about different ways people celebrate their birthdays. They were all very excited to have a birthday party for Tom!



Reception Superstars

The children in RW become Santa's Little Helpers this week and have helped to create their own Santa's Grotto. In their Grotto this week they have created Christmas decorations and written their rather long Christmas lists...... Santa and his team are going to be very busy so long as the children are on their very best behaviour.

They have also been learning about shadows this week - they talked about the way shadows are formed and how the size changes if the light source is close to the object or far away. They also created their own shadow puppets and using torches performed shadow puppet shows. What a very busy week for reception.



<u>The Wolf from the Three Little Pigs leaves a mess in 1B</u>

1B have had a very exciting week as the wolf from the Three Little Pigs story sneaked into their classroom during the night.

Look at the destruction he left in their classroom.

The children really enjoyed discussing how the wolf left a trail of devastation in their classroom. This event helped them to use past tense verbs as they retold what had happened. Excellent writing 1B – well done.





Investigating Solids

In science this week, Year 2 conducted an experiment to see how they could change the shape of different solids. The teachers made their

predictions and the children discussed who they agreed with and why. They used four actions when testing the shapes of each material (bend, twist, squash and stretch) and recorded their observations. They found out that the gooey slime (the favourite object tested!) was able to change shape the most, closely followed by blu tack and hair bands - but wooden pencils were the least flexible so couldn't change shape at all. In fact, when we tried to change the shape, it snapped.



The Industrial Revolution


6B continued their investigation into The Industrial Revolution this week, looking at the development of the Steam Engine and the explosion in the use of coal and iron in 19th Century Britain. The children were incredibly impressive in the way in which they could take historical facts and make statements about the wider implications on the nation due to these key innovations and

developments. Well done 6B historians!

In Year 6 and 6B, the children have been studying the novel, 'The Longest Night of Charlie Noon' in their English lessons. This week, the classes were visited on zoom by the author, Christopher Edge. The children asked excellent questions about the book and were given great advice on how to become a published author!
