Using this as inspiration, and with Tom's help, the children designed their own space setting and produced some amazing, descriptive pieces of writing.

become an artist. The way in which the children expressed their opinions and defined what art actually is was a pleasure to witness. Could the next Andy Warhol currently be studying in Belleville Wix?




Festive Friday
