

2nd July Update

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a very quiet week in school with five of our classes isolating. I also know it has been an anxious week for families who have been asked to isolate, for many reasons. We have a number of pupils registered with both BWA and EdW who have tested positive for COVID19 this week and I know you will join me in sending our well wishes to every child and our hope that they feel better very soon. Pupils who have tested positive for COVID19 have been in the classes identified as close contacts.

Every pupil is expected to be in school every day unless they have been asked to isolate. We are here to talk through any worries you have about your child being in school. This week we have been speaking with PHE/London Coronavirus Response Cell. I hope it is reassuring to know that they have no concerns with the protocols in place to reduce the identified risks of the virus spreading at school.

I am very grateful that families and staff did a LFT before returning to school on Monday. Doing these tests regularly will help us reduce the risk of the virus spreading in our community as they can identify asymptomatic cases. We are aware of some pupils who have tested positive this week who were asymptomatic.

The member of staff who tested positive last Thursday evening has been unwell with the virus. They did not display any of the three main symptoms of COVID19 so I am grateful to them for doing a LFT. On reflection, our closure on Friday was a good circuit breaker for the school community however I know this caused much inconvenience for so many of you. I am very grateful for your support and understanding.

Despite the easing of restrictions, the virus is still in wide circulation. 95% of the positive cases nationally are the Delta variant which we have been told is more transmissible. Please do not come on site if you or anyone in your household have any of the three main symptoms and get a PCR test. Close contacts are also advised to get a PCR test and should self- isolate.
