Our Nursery class have loved showing me the pictures of their parents that are hanging in picture frames in their home corner. I have been so impressed at how well they listen to the adults and each other in school.

Our Reception pupils have settled in really well. It has been lovely to see them working together and getting to know one another a little more. I have been very impressed with their counting this week.



Pupils in our Year 1 class have had a fantastic start to this school year, settling into new routines and beginning some exciting, challenging learning. They have been exploring numbers to 10 in their Maths lessons. Pupils enjoyed using resources to extend their understanding and participated actively in rich discussions with their learning partners.



In Year 2, pupils have started exploring a lovely story by Linda Sarah and Benjamin Davies, 'On Sudden Hill' during their English lessons. They reflected how important friendships were and had fun imagining what wonderful creations they would make with a cardboard box, like the two main characters in the book. They then wrote some amazing recounts of the story for me to read next week! I can't wait.

Pupils in Year 3 got off to a fantastic start with their learning in Science. A definite highlight was exploring the vital organs in the human body and then identifying the function of each.

4B have also settled in to the new academic year and excelled at explaining place value during their maths lessons this week.



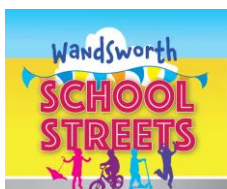
In Year 5LT, pupils were set a task in science to investigate which surfaces are most appropriate for pulling weights as part of the research for a new racing car prototype. With the help of a Newton Meter, they experimented on a variety of surfaces to determine which material had the least amount of friction, ensuring they maintained a fair test throughout.

At the start of their geography lesson this week, pupils in Y5M were asked to pull objects out of a 'mystery bag'. Having retrieved items such as a bottle of water, fruit, oats and 'gold', they discussed what they have in common and quickly came to the conclusion that they will be learning all about natural resources this half term.

Year 6 have had a super week as well and this morning it was a joy to read their diary entries that showcased the variety of sentence openers they can use to make their writing engaging for the reader. I was also very happy to see excellent vocabulary choices being used to ensure the reader knew exactly how the person felt.



As the sun shone this week everyone loved having PE outside. At the start of this school year we focus on team building and communication in our PE lessons to help us during our Outdoor Adventurous Activities unit.
