quickly. Knowing times tables facts provides the building blocks for understanding higher learning, such as long multiplication, long division, fractions and fraction of numbers, algebra and solving word problems.

Pupils in our Nursery have been exploring all things autumn and Halloween this week. They closely investigated a variety of pumpkins, scooping out the contents and discussing what they found. Next, they planted some of the seeds in the hope we might grow our own pumpkins, unless of course, the hungry squirrels get to them first.

A highlight for pupils in 1B has been dropping eggs onto different materials, predicting which materials would crack their 'humpty dumpty' and which ones would save him during their Science lessons. The materials they tested were water, plastic, metal, wood, wool, foam and

bricks. Do you know which materials would be better for him to land on?



This week Year 1 started their new History topic all about how life has changed. We began by looking at how we have changed from babies into children, and then zoomed out to see how this fits into a timeline of the Earth. The children loved exploring the different eras and discovering how our world has changed over time!

This week in Geography, Year 2 were shocked to find out that there were over 8 billion people on planet Earth. They discussed what densely populated and sparsely populated meant, and reflected on what kind of area we live in. Using their research skills they located Belleville Wix Academy on Google Earth - which was very exciting.



In Year 3 this week, pupils had a brilliant time exploring the Roman invasion of Britain. They explored what the peak of the Roman Empire looked like and had the chance to examine different Roman artefacts from archaeologist dig sites.

To launch their new history topic, pupils in Year 4 got the chance to take part in an archaeological dig. They searched for artefacts in a sandbox before discussing what clues each artefact gave them. Everyone is looking forward to learning more about the Anglo-Saxons.





Pupils in 4B have been reading The Lost Thing by Shaun Tan. They spent time exploring the characters and setting, before creating expanded noun phrases with prepositional phrases, such as – "the red, metallic teapot with many doors' and 'like a teapot with claws.'



During their Science lessons, pupils in 5M enjoyed **launching** their new topic about earth and space - quite literally. Pupils were tasked with creating their own rockets and had to consider the knowledge they gained about forces last half term to ensure that their design was as efficient as possible.

5LT's highlight this week was also creating space rockets to 'send to the moon'. Pupils discussed which forces they would need to consider in their designs before creating their own prototypes out of straws, balloons and tape.



Pupils in 5B started their new Geography topic - Water and Natural Resources. In

their first few lessons they thought about what natural resources are and discovered that water - a vital natural resource - is in shortage across the globe. They learned about some of the reasons behind this water scarcity.



Year 6 have been immersed in journalistic writing, identifying features of newspaper reports. They have been learning about the bombing at Balham Underground Station on 14th October 1940 and have begun planning a report to cover the key events. Year 6 have enhanced their skills in writing direct quotations, as well as practising writing effective and formal relative clauses.


<u>Communication</u>

Information on Measles / MMR vaccination – message from the NHS

Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,000 children starting primary school in England being at risk of catching the disease. We are asking education settings to share key messages from the NHS about MMR / measles and how to get vaccinated.

The <u>Back to school MMR Guidance</u> from the NHS includes information to share, as well as example social media posts which can be found here: <u>NHS Vaccine Poster</u> and <u>NHS MMR Poster</u>.

Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in a classroom can catch the disease if just one child is infectious.
