

Here are some of the highlights of our great week together.



During Clean Air Day last week, Nursery learned that dirty air can make us ill and that trees help to clean it. This week, pupils designed some clean air super heroes who can either clean the air themselves using a whole range of powers, from capturing smoke in their Rapunzel-like hair to propeller arms that blow it away. Lots of the heroes also use their powers to look after the trees too. Such great ideas from our real life, little super heroes in Nursery.

This week, pupils in $\ensuremath{\mathsf{RW}}$ have been busy making

posters to encourage everyone to save our planet. They have been sharing creative ways to be eco superheroes. Here, you can see how pupils used mixed media to create their own versions of Planet Earth.

In addition to their eco-friendly projects, our RW pupils are gearing up for their first Sports Day. They have been learning about the Olympics and discussing what they are most excited about participating in during Sports Day. We are so proud of their enthusiasm and creativity



Year 1 have been building upon their understanding of traditional tales this week by learning

about princesses, dragons and mice who challenge stereotypes of fairy tale characters. Their story language has been fantastic and the creativity they have used to plan some innovative takes on the stories we have read is amazing.

This week, pupils in 1B have worked really hard on planning and writing their own versions of Jack and the Beanstalk. They have thought carefully about ambitious vocabulary they can use to make their writing interesting and are looking forward to publishing their very exciting stories.

This week, Year 2 pupils delved deeper into their Science topic by comparing the life cycles of different amphibians.

They researched and identified similarities and differences between the stages of life of frogs, toads, and newts.

Our pupils are now experts and can articulate how these fascinating creatures evolve through their unique life cycles.









Year 3 had the most wonderful time learning with our Residential Artists this week. Pupils learnt about the famous Swiss artist Alberto Giacometti and researched some of his pieces of work. After learning more about him, pupils also found out some facts about Switzerland too. Maybe a school trip in the making?

After completing their research, they were ready to create their very own Giacometti inspired pieces of art. They loved every minute of it and created some fantastic pieces, as I am sure you agree form these photos.





4B have been learning all about Sir Ernest Shackleton and his epic journey to become the first to cross the continent of Antarctica. Shackleton raised funds, purchased the Endurance for a great deal and hired a crew of 27 men, including: able seamen, scientists, photographers, geologists as well as 69 dogs. This week, we have been reflecting on what it might have been like to be selected to be part of this dangerous expedition in the hope of achieving something no-one had before.

Pupils in our Year 4 class explored how much

change there was to England during King Henry's reign. After watching videos and discussing the reformation, they created a timeline of all the major events during the monarch's time on the throne. At the end, pupils added post it notes to the events which they felt had the biggest effect on the country.

Our year 5 pupils have loved learning more about 'volume' this week in Maths. They created structures with cubes to problem solve and help them through their work. Pupils are now starting to think of real life problems they could solve with their new knowledge.





Whilst in 5B, pupils have used their fantastic knowledge of measuring in centimetres and meters to further extend their

measuring and conversion skills using metric and imperial units. The class have considered when they see each measuring system being used, what is beneficial about each system and how this will help them in their real life.

Year 6 pupils have continued reading Shaun Tan's book, 'The Arrival', in their English lessons. Pupils have inferred information from the illustrations and have pieced together the first three chapters, writing their own narratives from one of the flashbacks. The class are excited to read on and discover the fates of the protagonists of the story.
