In Nursery, the pupils have been exploring the topic of Dentists and teeth. They investigated which foods help keep our teeth healthy, with Arielle particularly excited to learn that carrots are a great choice. The pupils also practiced cleaning playdough 'plaque' from unhealthy teeth, which was both educational and fun.

Reception pupils continued their fascinating learning about Dinosaurs. They used clay and mini dinosaur toys to create

fossil imprints with footprints, heads, tails, and bodies. These clay fossils are now drying, and once painted, they will form a stunning Fossil Exhibition in RA. The fossils look impressively realistic already!





Our Year 1 pupils had a creative time preparing for Chinese New Year with our resident artist, Mrs. Hatcher. They learned about Chinese vases and cherry blossoms and, since 2025 is the Year of the Snake, practiced drawing snakes onto their vase designs. The pupils enjoyed mixing paints to find the perfect shades for the cherry blossoms and created beautiful, detailed artwork.



Meanwhile, in 1B, pupils immersed themselves in the story *Traction Man*. They retold the story through role play, wrote their own versions of key events, and described the character with fantastic imagination.







Our Year 2 pupils explored portraiture and tone with Mrs. Hatcher, focusing on William Shakespeare as their subject. Using pencils, oil pastels, and staining techniques, they worked diligently to bring depth and expression to their portraits. The results were outstanding, and they are

all excited for their next art sessions.



In Year 3, the focus was on Ancient Egypt. Pupils learned about hieroglyphics and wrote their names on papyrus using this fascinating writing system. The activity brought history to life in an engaging and hands-on way.

Year 4 explored data representation by creating and interpreting Pictograms, Bar Graphs, and Line Graphs. Pupils loved showcasing their learning in diverse ways.

In 4B, pupils were focused on classifying animals by studying their characteristics,

such as body structure and skin type. Hands-on activities and the use of Carroll Diagrams made this a memorable and enriching lesson.

In Year 5, the pupils delved into their new science topic on Forces. Through experiments, they explored how rough and

smooth surfaces affect friction. Their curiosity and teamwork shone as they investigated the effects in real time.
