This week, Nursery pupils have been learning all about the Police. It was perfect timing, as our phonics bear, Fred, mysteriously went missing! The pupils used their writing skills to create missing posters, experimented with ink fingerprinting to identify suspects, and put their investigative skills to the test to solve the mystery. What an exciting way to learn about the important role of the Police!



Reception learned about Chinese New Year this week. Everyone learned how their New Year's celebrations are different. The pupils made a variety of crafts linked with it - paper lanterns, snake paperchains for the year of the snake and writing numbers in Chinese. I was very impressed with their painting of Chinese numbers.



Pupils in 1B have been exploring Christianity and the significance of symbols in everyday life. They discussed symbols that are

particularly important to Christians and the meanings they hold. This thought-provoking discussion helped them understand how symbols can communicate beliefs and values.



Year 1 had an unforgettable science lesson this week, thanks to a visit from Safari Pete!

As part of their science unit on animals, pupils had the chance to see and even hold some amazing creatures, including a bearded dragon lizard, a meerkat, a tarantula, a tree frog, a scorpion, a snake, a barn owl, a ferret, and more! It was an incredible opportunity to learn about these fascinating animals up close.






Year 2 have had a fantastic week, enjoying a visit from Florence Nightingale from the Drama Shed on Tuesday where they used drama techniques to learn about the story of Florence. Pupils got to bandage a wounded soldier and use their bodies to represent the different things Florence achieved. Pupils also learnt about Mary Seacole and her place in history.

Pupils in Year 3 had a great time during their

study of Egyptian monuments. Working in groups, pupils researched different monuments and then presented their findings to the class. Well done to all for their teamwork and impressive presentations!



UK. They explored how MPs represent their communities in the House of Commons and how they assist with important issues such as education, housing, and government services. Through interactive activities, pupils gained a deeper understanding of democracy and how voting enables citizens to have their voices heard.



During their lessons with our Resident Artist, Mrs Hatcher, Year 4 explored icy landscapes through painting. They experimented with different shades of blue, white, and even bright colours to capture the magic of icebergs and the ocean. Using watercolours, they learned how to make their icebergs appear shiny and smooth. Their artistic creations are truly stunning!









Our Year 5 pupils investigated air resistance and its effect on the speed at which objects fall to Earth. As part of this experiment, they designed and created parachutes to test how air resistance works in real life. This handson activity was both fun and educational, allowing pupils to apply their learning in an exciting way.



Year 6 have been continuing their three-week-long practical experiment on heart rate and pulse. Pupils have been measuring their own pulses, learning how to locate them accurately, and recording their heartbeats before and after different types of exercise. Many were surprised to discover that some activities they expected to be easy actually made their hearts work much harder than anticipated.

In 6B, pupils were learning about the function of blood and the different components that make up our blood. They used sweets and water to highlight the percentage of white blood cells, red blood cells, platelets and plasma.
