Thank you for continuing to do regular testing at home to ensure asymptomatic cases are being identified. It will be important that this continues after half term. BWA has just come out of the 'amber zone' of restrictions for schools (when additional measures are put in place to try to stop the transmission) after the high transmission we had in year 3.

Wearing face masks, adhering to social distancing and regular testing are essential for us to maintain to ensure we minimise the impact on our pupils learning. It would be very helpful if families could do a LFT on the Sunday before returning to school after the half term break.



Last Thursday we took part in the Wandsworth Primary Schools Cross Country Event. Pupils from Year 5 and 6 competed against fifteen other schools across the borough, running against approximately 70 other pupils in their respective races.

We were very proud to see our pupils run the 1500m course around Tooting Common, taking on the unfamiliar challenge of running on a wet, uneven surface. They put in a lot of effort and were very enthusiastic. They represented our school brilliantly, showing great sportsmanship and

cheering on pupils from other schools, as well as our own. A special mention must go to Rayan who won the Year 5 Boys' race - a phenomenal achievement! We believe he will be invited to represent BWA and Wandsworth at the London Primary Schools Cross Country Event in the coming weeks. Well done all!





Year 4 been creating food chains and labelling them in science. They know what a producer and consumer is.


Reading and developing a love of books is a focus for us at BWA. Year 4 are really enjoying reading their class book, 'Blast off Into Space Like Mae Jamison.'

Pupils in 5B have been learning about the life of Walter Tull, one of Britain's first black professional footballers and a war hero who became one of Britain's first black officers in the army during World War One. The maturity and understanding of how significant Walter Tull's place in British history is was hugely impressive and it was inspiring to see how the pupils showed genuine interest in the story of this great man.



Year 6 and 6B participated in a poetry workshop from the fantastic Karl Nova whose work they have been studying in English. The pupils were very excited to hear Karl perform some of their favourite poems and used this inspiration to write their own.
