Last Saturday, twenty six BWA pupils took part in the TCS mini marathon race. It was a truly amazing experience for pupils in Reception through to Year 6 (and their parents!) to run part of the

London Marathon route and cross the actual finish line, the day before the event. Reception to Year 5 pupils ran the last mile of the course. Year 6 pupils ran a longer distance of 2.6km. Miss Stevenson was there to cheer everyone on. I was at a Q1E

Trust morning so missed the occasion. The buzz at the school gate on Monday was electric as pupils wore their medals to school with pride. There was much excitement in our Nursery this week when pupils baked their own gingerbread men and couldn't wait to share with their parents at home time. Pupils carefully weighed out the ingredients, took it in turns to mix the dough and then rolled out the dough before cutting out their gingerbread men. There was a lot of talk about how they could stop them from running away, as in the story 'The Gingerbread Man'.




Pupils in RW have been discussing families. They listened to lots of stories all about families and learnt that not



all families are the same. Everyone created a beautiful family tree using paints and their handprints.

In Year 1, pupils have enjoyed learning more about senses and using the sign language they learnt last week. Pupil explored how we see and used mirrors to find all the different parts of their eyes. They learnt about the iris, the pupil, eyebrows and eyelashes.

Pupils in 1B have been showing us what amazing authors they are. They were inspired by the book, 'The Everywhere Bear,' to create an adventure for their class bear, Tom. I was very impressed listening to their ideas in class because they could describe in detail what adventures he could get up to, linked to the location of the adventure – for example going swimming at the beach.



Pupils in 2B have been learning how to add 2 digit numbers with multiples of 10's, using

Dines and then the column method. Pupils can confidently calculate 18 + 30 by adding the tens together and then the ones. We have a very strong maths programme at BWA and it is wonderful to see pupils mastering the skills they need to be confident, successful mathematicians.




Our year 2 pupils really loved learning with our resident artist, experimenting with pencil techniques, sponge painting, learning how to use oil pastels and water colours.

Pupils created some wonderful works of art inspired by Aboriginal art and the theme of story-telling. We are so looking forward to displaying their master pieces around the school and in the classroom.







In 3S, pupils are enjoying reading the wonderful book, 'Fly, Eagle, Fly". This inspired them to plan and write a poem about the story. Pupils used expanded noun phrases in their writing as well as verses and repetition to create their fantastic poems before performing them to the rest of the class.

Pupils in 3M have been busy learning about France and Francophone countries in their French lesson. Pupils shared their knowledge of all things French, ranging from the Eiffel Tower and Emmanuel Macron to croissants. They were able to label

the major cities on a map of France and now know there are twenty-nine French speaking countries in the world.

There may have been a rail strike but that didn't stop our plans to take Year 4 to the British Museum this week. Pupils in both Year 4 classes investigated artefacts from North America to deepen their understanding of our Geography unit. We are very grateful to the parents who helped us on the day – thank you. Sincere thanks to Miss Wadsworth and Mr Abraham for organising the trip to enhance pupils learning experiences.

It was a joy to see our Year 5 pupils investigating how parachutes work. Knowing how they work helped pupils plan a science experiment to establish how the size of canopy affected the speed of travel. Pupils constructed four parachutes, each with a different size of canopy and then dropped them from the same height to time how long they took to reach the ground. Pupils concluded that the greater the surface area, the more air resistance it encounters therefore the longer it takes to float to the ground.





It is so important that pupils have a quick recall of the timetables facts so they are successful mathematicians. Pupils in Year 6 have been using their knowledge of times tables facts to master long division. Pupils used partitioning, and bar models, to answer challenging word problems.
