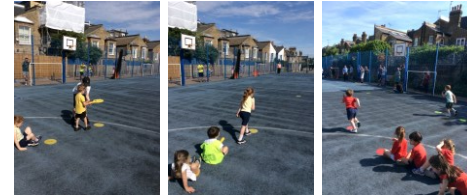

Our Week – Early Years and Key Stage 1

Nursery were very excited to have their Sports Day this week. The children showed great confidence and lovely teamwork, cheering each other on in every race.



This week, **Reception** enjoyed recapping subtraction in Maths and using their Maths Monsters to help with their learning.

The children also had fun designing and building different creations, including houses and cars, using a range of construction materials. It was lovely to see them working together and using their creativity.

RB have been continuing with their Big Wide World Topic. They used stencils to create their own jungle kingdoms, choosing their favourite animal and putting them into a jungle habitat.



Year 1 have enjoyed consolidating all their maths learning from across the year. They have been reviewing key skills and applying what they have learned in a range of activities. The children have also been working hard to complete their maths workbooks.

Year 2 enjoyed a wonderful class trip, travelling by Uber Boat to Battersea Park for a picnic. The children were excited by the journey on the river and had a lovely time having lunch together and exploring the park. The outing provided a memorable opportunity to learn beyond the classroom while building friendships and celebrating the end of a successful term.





Our Week – Key Stage 2

Year 3 have had a fabulous week, enjoying the sunshine! A particular highlight has been a visit from a librarian from our local library on Lavender Hill. She spoke to the children about the exciting reading challenge that is taking place throughout the summer. They can't wait to get reading!



This week, with the sunshine brightening our days, **Year 4** have been busy completing their final pieces of work. It has been wonderful to hear all the children speak so confidently about their learning, sharing everything they have learnt and making thoughtful connections across different subjects. We are incredibly proud of the progress they have made and the enthusiasm they continue to show as we approach the end of the school year. Can't believe there's only one week to go!

4B have been exploring the wonderful poetry of Joseph Coelho. The pupils studied his poetic style and enjoyed performing poems, experimenting with pitch, tempo and expression to bring the words to life. Inspired by his poem *A Little Bit Of*, the children then created their own versions based on the theme of art, using imaginative language to celebrate creativity and self-expression.

Year 5 have combined their Computing and History skills by creating slide presentations to answer the thought-provoking question, Who gets remembered, and why? Through their research, pupils explored what makes people, events and achievements historically significant, considering how views of significance can change from one generation to the next. Using Google Slides, pupils organised their research into engaging slides, developing both their digital skills and their understanding of how history is remembered and interpreted.

This week **5B** drew inspiration from the geometry of Islamic art, linking to their previous history unit on the early Islamic civilisation. They have been learning to print tessellating patterns.

Year 6 had a day with an artist this week, completing still lifes of doughnuts. They developed their pencil shading skills and used colour theory to paint the other half, producing some truly mouth-watering results!

Year 5 Dance

Last week, our Year 5 pupils wowed the audience with an energetic breakdance battle performance! They showcased an impressive range of skills, including body popping, robotic dance, top rocking, breakdance holds, spins, and exciting acrobatic moves. The children performed with great confidence, enthusiasm, and teamwork, making the routine both entertaining and memorable. It was clear how much effort they had put into practising, and, most importantly, they had a fantastic time performing. Well done to all our Year 5 dancers for such a superb performance!
