## Our Week – Early Years and Key Stage 1

**Nursery** had a very special visit this week from Safari Pete and his animals. They held barn owls, stroked ferrets, watched lizards catch their prey and learnt a lot about these very interesting animals.

The pupils have really enjoyed learning about fossils in **Reception** this week. They learnt about Mary Anning and discussed the important work she did. They loved taking turns to look at the different fossils.



Our **Year 1** pupils were also lucky enough to have a special visit from Safari Pete, and it was an experience the children will remember for a long time. The pupils enjoyed the opportunity to see and learn about a range of amazing animals up close. During the visit, they met a tarantula, an Australian white tree frog, and even watched a barn owl flying across the school hall. They were amazed by a friendly meerkat who sat on the teacher's shoulders, a ferret who showed off a little dance, and some impressive green iguanas. During the visit, pupils saw mammals, reptiles, amphibians, and birds. The only animal group they didn't get to see was fish. It was a fantastic experience of hands-on learning and tied in perfectly with their science unit on Amazing Animals.

**1B** also had a very exciting afternoon being visited by Safari Pete and his collection of exotic animals. The children loved exploring their understanding of different reptiles, mammals and amphibians by looking at the animals up close, even getting a chance to touch them. Everyone had a wonderful time.

In **Year 2**, the pupils have been learning about staying healthy in both body and mind. In Science, the children have been exploring healthy eating, learning about different food groups and how a balanced diet helps them grow and stay strong. In PSHCE, they have been focusing on having a healthy mind by talking about their emotions and understanding how they feel in different situations. The pupils have also been practising simple strategies to help them stay calm, such as taking deep breaths and thinking positively, so they can manage their feelings confidently throughout the day.

**2B** have been reading 'The Invisible' this week, a book all about finding the beauty in the things around us. The pupils have been generating exciting language to write their own setting description. They have also been measuring the temperature, mass and length in maths, and they have enjoyed looking at the weather around the world. They also learnt about Joseph Bazalgette, and the Great Stink of 1858.



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

## Our Week – Key Stage 2

**Year 3** have had a fabulous week. They have particularly enjoyed using Lego Spike to create their own Lego carnival games, by coding the movement by using iPads.

In Science, **3B** have been learning about the four layers of the Earth: the crust, mantle, outer core and inner core. The pupils explored what each layer is made of and discovered some amazing facts about what's happening deep beneath their feet.



This week, **Year 4** had lots of fun learning about electricity. The pupils discovered how electricity flows and what is needed to make a circuit work. They used batteries, wires and bulbs to build their own circuits and were excited to see the bulbs light up. The children learnt that electricity can only flow when a circuit is complete. Everyone worked brilliantly together and enjoyed being young scientists.

In **Year 5**, the pupils began learning about the difference between weather and climate in their geography lessons. They explored the five main climate zones of the world and located countries within each one. The children discussed the long-term weather conditions that shape different climates and enjoyed discovering how weather patterns vary across the globe.

The **Year 6** pupils made a model of human blood. They have dived into their learning about the components of blood - platelets, red blood cells, white blood cells and plasma - and how they help the body to function. Then, they used a range of edible goods to create a model of blood with (fairly) accurate ratios of each component. Great work, Year 6.

**6B** are also learning about the circulatory system in science this term. They enjoyed using sweets to demonstrate the four different components of blood.



## Sports Update

This term, pupils at BWA will be learning rugby, with each session tailored to their stage of development. In Key Stage 1, the children focus on developing fundamental movement and ball skills such as running, catching, passing, and teamwork through fun and engaging activities.



In Key Stage 2, pupils progress to learning the new T1 Rugby rules, building on these foundations to develop game awareness, decision-making, and collaboration in a safe, non-contact format. It has been wonderful to see pupils gaining confidence, demonstrating excellent sportsmanship, and showing enthusiasm for rugby.
