We also saw some amazing teamwork and creativity in their outdoor play, where the children used the rainy weather as an opportunity to build a brilliant network of bridges over the puddles in the playground.




Last week, **Reception** went on a trip to the Natural History Museum. The pupils had a wonderful time and loved exploring Mary Anning's fossils and the dinosaurs, especially the big one that moved!



This week's Traditional Tale was the Three Little Pigs. **RB** made 'Wanted' posters to try and catch the Big Bad wolf while also designing new houses for the pigs to live in. The pupils discussed what would be the best materials to use and why.

This week, **Year 1** have really enjoyed learning about how clothes have changed over time as part of their history unit. The children explored how outfits have changed over the past 200 years and discussed the differences between clothing worn in the past and what we wear today. They particularly enjoyed choosing outfits for people from the past and the present and sticking them onto person outlines. The children have shown a lot of enthusiasm and curiosity and are thoroughly enjoying their history unit so far.



In English, **Year 2** have loved reading The Twits by Roald Dahl and exploring the cheeky characters of Mr and Mrs Twit. Inspired by the story, the pupils created their own imaginative Twits-style tricks, using exciting adjectives, detailed drawings and clear step-by-step writing. They showed fantastic creativity and enthusiasm, and we are very proud of their hard work.

## Our Week – Key Stage 2

**Year 3** have had a wonderful week! They have particularly enjoyed their English and History learning about the Ancient Egyptians. In English, the class have been learning how to write instructions to mummify a body. The children took part in a mummification role play to write the steps in order for their instructions.



**Year 4** took part in an exciting and immersive lesson using Now Press Play, an interactive headset-based app that brings learning to life through storytelling and physical movement. The experience encouraged children to re-imagine and recreate their learning by actively stepping into the story, making lessons both engaging and memorable.




The session focused on electricity and challenged pupils to apply the skills and knowledge they had been developing in class. Through the story, the pupils had to work together to navigate their way safely home after a local power station — Battersea Power Station in our case — suffered a dramatic explosion. The children were fully engaged throughout, demonstrating excellent problem-solving, teamwork and enthusiasm, while deepening their understanding of key scientific concepts in a fun and meaningful way.

This week, **4B** have been practising the [bus-stop method for long division](#).

In Geography, **Year 5** pupils have been learning about climates and biomes, exploring what threatens different environments around the world. They studied a range of biomes including deserts, rainforests, woodlands, savannahs, tundra and grasslands. Pupils then chose a biome to focus on and created eye-catching posters highlighting the threats it faces and possible solutions to help protect it. Their work was fuelled by creativity and thoughtful research, resulting in some fantastic displays.

**5B** designed their own experiments to see what affects how quickly sugar dissolves. The children considered how they could implement 'fair testing' and used their team skills to allocate roles in the process. All the children proved they are super scientists!



**Year 6** pupils explored nutrition by playing 'Food Top Trumps'. They learned about which foods are rich in protein, carbohydrates, calcium, vitamin C and other nutrients, as well as how a balanced diet of these nutrients help their bodies to stay healthy.



## Sports Update

Our Year 5 & 6 girls' football team had a wonderful day out competing in the Wandsworth Cup and should be incredibly proud of their efforts. The team finished 3rd in their group, playing 6 games with 3 wins and 3 losses, showing great teamwork and resilience throughout the tournament. Goals were scored by Georgia, Olive, Martha, Lea and Elanora, with some fantastic attacking play on display. Player of the Tournament goes to Martha, who made a real impact when it mattered scoring two goals in a brilliant 3-1 victory over Ravenstone. A special mention also goes to Jada, who was superb in goal while playing in this position for the first time, making some excellent saves and showing great decision-making. Well done to all the girls on a fantastic performance!

## Imagine Children's Festival


