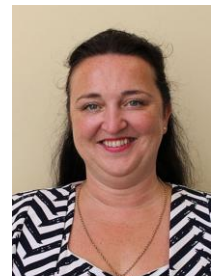
In the meantime, this newsletter gives you a brief overview of what our pupils have been learning during the Spring term.

Spring Term at Belleville Wix Academy

English and Maths are at the core of what we teach, in every class, every day at BWA. We also have a formally recognised highly impressive and engaging wider curriculum. Here are some of last term's highlights of the diverse and exciting curriculum we offer across all subjects for all our pupils.



In Sport, we have specialist teachers in PE, gymnastics and dance. In PE, our pupils have been introduced to the basics of rugby, netball and basketball. This term, some of our pupils have represented the school at an indoor athletics tournament, gymnastics competition, football tournament and netball tournament and we are proud of all that they have achieved. We also have our house teams where the pupils gain house points for showing kindness and sportsmanship.

In Art, our Year 5 pupils participated in an artists' workshop as part of Wandsworth Borough of Culture to improve the tunnel at Falcon Road. In Music, our older children worked on challenging harmonies as part of a vocal project, and our Year 5 children performed at the Fairfield Halls as part of Wandsworth Music's Brighter Sounds concert.

We also love science at BWA! As well as celebrating British Science Week across the school, Year 1 had an unforgettable science lesson about animals from Safari Pete, whilst Year 2 have been learning how germs spread, and Year 4 have been exploring electricity. In History, Year 3 have been exploring Ancient Egypt, and Year 4 have been studying the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons. In Computing, our Year 3 children developed their coding skills using Chromebooks and Lego Spike.

Meanwhile, in Reception, the children have been learning all about dinosaurs - designing their own dinosaurs and discovering fossils in our sandpits. They have also been learning about traditional tales, creating boats for the Gingerbread Man to cross the water safely and using their Phonics knowledge to make 'Wanted' posters for Goldilocks and the Three Bears.



We are always looking at ways to bring learning to life. During this term, we have taken our children to visit Fulham Palace, Natural History Museum, Petrie Museum of Egyptian Archaeology, Science Museum, and the local fire station. In school, we have had workshops about Florence Nightingale, Play in a Day for World Book Day, and a gardening workshop for Early Years and Key Stage 1. We celebrated World Book Day, International Women's Day, and welcomed children's mothers and mother figures for our Mother's Day events. Our Pupil Voice is very active with our School Council, Eco-Council and Sports Council and Year 6 hosted an amazing dining event to raise funds for their residential trip to France later in the year. As you can see the children have been very busy! We do hope you will choose BWA for your child, and we will be able to welcome them in September.
