

They loved finding out more facts about space and seeing in real life some of the space artefacts that they have been studying in school. Everyone in the class came away with even more knowledge on space, ready to add to their space non-fiction texts they are currently writing.

This week in 2B, we followed up our reading of Mae Among the Stars by continuing our space theme. We began the week by organising facts about space into different topics, before planning and writing our own information

texts to help people learn about space, using formal language and rhetorical questions to engage the reader.

On Monday, Year 3 visited the Natural History Museum to enhance their understanding of rocks. They explored the minerals and rocks exhibition and took part in the 'Dino Dig' workshop where they got the chance to be archaeologists, exploring a range of dinosaur fossils.
